Eligibility

Applicants must be citizens of Myanmar. They must have an undergraduate degree in a relevant subject, be fluent in English and able to meet all entrance requirements of the university.

Scholarship support

Hinrich Foundation offers full scholarship support. The following will be covered at a basic level:

- Academic tuition and mandatory fees for the duration of the course, including exam costs
- A monthly allowance for room and board, and living expenses sufficient for a single student
- Support for educational supplies and materials
- Airfare for the scholar's travel to the university and back to their country
- All costs related to securing and maintaining a student visa for the duration of study

Career development

One of our goals is to give Scholars a solid career foundation in a trade-related field to help them develop marketable skills and contribute to our mission of promoting sustainable global trade. To that end, Scholars are required to sign a binding Agreement, cosigned by a family member, that requires the Scholars to undertake – if a posting is offered – an internship and work for a period of two years upon graduation with Global Sources (NASDAQ: GSOL www.globalsources.com), the Hinrich Foundation or other organizations to be advised. Work will be in a role and geographic location paid at local market rates.

Should Scholars decline employment offer, the full amount of the Scholarship must be repaid.

Materials required for online application

Note that this online scholarship application must be completed in one sitting, and will require applicant to attach the following documents:

- Cover letter
- Resume stating work experience & education achievement
- A 1,000-word essay: Why I am passionate about career promoting sustainable global trade
- Copy of official transcripts
- Scanned copy of passport / ID photo page
- One academic and one professional letter of reference
